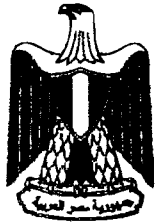

Statement by the Coordinating Bureau of the Non-Aligned Movement on The Statement of the United States Transportation Security Administration on New Security Measures for International Flights to the United States

The Coordinating Bureau of the Non-Aligned Movement categorically rejects the recent decision taken by the Government of the United States of America to include unfairly and arbitrarily nationals and travellers who hold passports issued by or are travelling from or through fourteen Non-Aligned Movement member countries, in a unilateral list of those requiring special compulsory and discriminatory scrutiny at airports, of which some countries are accused by the Department of State of being "sponsors of international terrorism" and others are considered "countries of interest".

The Non-Aligned Movement Coordinating Bureau totally rejects the unilateral preparation of lists accusing States of allegedly supporting terrorism, which are inconsistent with international law and constitute on their part a form of psychological and political terrorism.

While reaffirming its positions regarding terrorism, the Non-Aligned Movement Coordinating Bureau urges all States, consistent with the United Nations Charter, to fulfil their obligations under international law and international humanitarian law combating terrorism; including by observing and implementing the provisions of all international conventions as well as regional and bilateral instruments relating to terrorism to which they are parties.

As a consequence, the Non-Aligned Movement Coordinating Bureau condemns any qualification that is unacceptable for States and could harm bilateral relations; and emphasizes the defense of multilateralism and multilateral organizations as the appropriate frameworks to resolve, through dialogue and cooperation, the problems affecting humankind.
